



Edgar married Elizabeth Mastin (left, above) who was known as Bess. In later life after Bess died he married Lena who is pictured on the right above.

Edgar took over the bakery from Thomas in 1943 although apparently he only originally went to help out for a couple of weeks. For many years the bakery made its deliveries in the village and surrounding area using a horse and cart.

Many villagers remember the cart and it is pictured below outside cottages on Cotton End Road, Wilstead with Edgar at the horse's head.

The horse knew the round by itself and would follow Edgar and later his son Ken, as they went from door to door. When the bakery began delivering with a van, Ken remembers Edgar saying 'Well that won't come when I whistle'.
